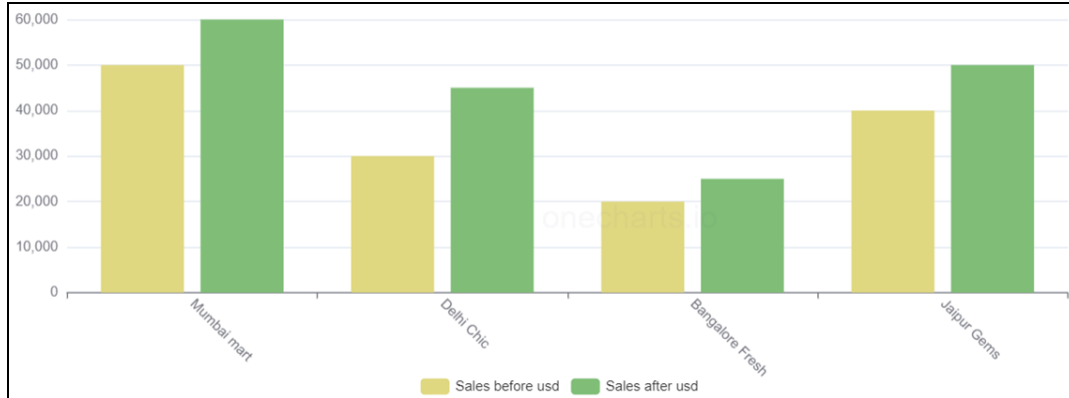


Fig 1: Sales Performance Comparison (Monthly Sales Before and After Vaastu Implementation)

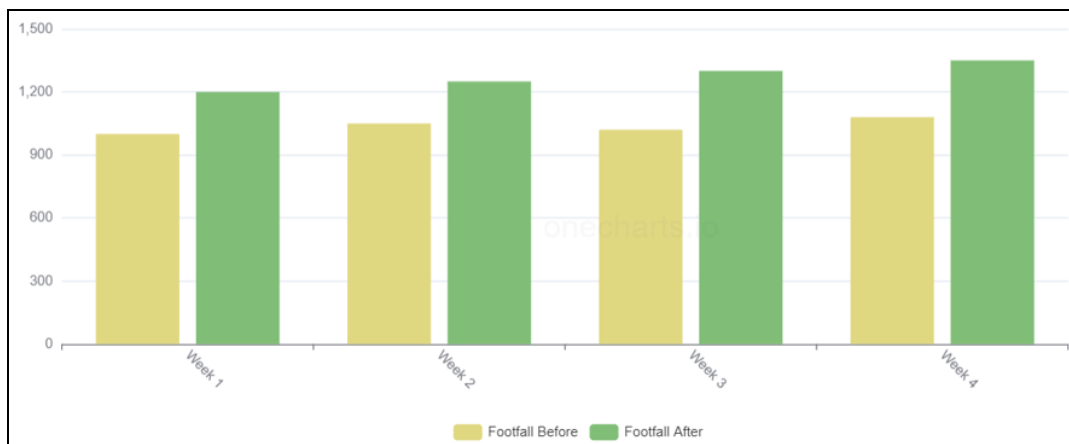


Fig 2: Customer Satisfaction Survey Results (Before and After Vaastu Implementation)
